DEVELOPMENT REPORT – VILLAGE CENTER

The Planning Board is scheduled to take action on Thursday, April 26 on plans to renovate and add some retail density and new housing to the 18-plus acre property.

Originally, the Sketch Plan included an apartment complex with parking garage at the rear of the Village Center. The latest plans now include 49 townhouses, 34 two-overtwo condos and 32 condos/ apartments; however, only the 32 condos/apartments are included in the Site Plan that Atlantic Realty Companies (ARC) is seeking approval for from the Planning Board. The remaining housing units will be included in a future Site Plan for the property.

The retail redevelopment will be phased in and will include the creation of new path sites on the front of the property and the extension of Centerway Road through to Watkins Mill Road, which will create a connection between the residential development and new retail.

MVF's Commercial Architectural Review Committee (CARC) has had several reviews of the plans and continues to believe that ARC is moving in the right direction with architectural design and layout. CARC will be reviewing additional plans with more detail at an upcoming meeting.

STATE LEGISLATIVE **WRAP-UP**

The 2018 Legislative Session ended on April 9. Over 3,100 bills were introduced, but no significant bills affecting Montgomery Village HOAs or condominiums passed.

Bills requiring the licensing of HOA managers did not gain support again this year. In addition, bills regulating HOA/ condo boards of directors for voting procedures, meeting notifications and adoption of rules did not garner enough support to pass.

Several legislators continued to argue that there must be more standardization of rules, procedures and governing documents for HOAs and condos. For example, the issue of dispute resolution procedures for HOAs and condos was a new issue before the legislature, with the goal of imposing a state-wide dispute resolution procedure. None of these bills passed.

With regard to condominiums only, there was a bill that would set out a state-wide standard for denying the use of parking and recreational elements to persons who are more than 60 days delinquent. The bill did not pass, but it is anticipated that the bill will be reintroduced in the 2019

Lastly, again for condominiums, there was a bill to make it easier for condominium members to amend their governing documents, but this did not pass either.

CFO REPLACEMENT

The process continues to find a new Chief Financial Officer (CFO) to replace Greg Snellings, who resigned in early March. The CFO is charged with leading MVF's Finance and Administration Department. Initial interviews have been completed, and an announcement should be made shortly.

- 2. The *Montgomery Village News* will make every effort to publish all letters received during the weeks prior to

publication that meet the criteria of this policy.

- 3. All letters (typed, handwritten or e-mailed) must be received no later than 5 p.m. on the Monday prior to publication and distribution. When a holiday occurs on a deadline Monday, Letters to the Editor must be received no later than noon on the subsequent Tuesday prior to the Friday publication and distribution.
- 4. Letters must bear the writer's name, address and telephone number for verification purposes. E-mailed letters should contain the subject line "Letter to the Editor." Happy Spring! The Montgomery County Police (MCPD) 6th District has a great deal going on that we wanted to share. I recently returned from the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) National Academy. This program is a 10-week law enforcement leadership program that takes place at the FBI Academy in Quantico, Va. The class is made up of approximately 200 law enforcement leaders from all over the United States and world. There were 19 international students in my class. I was able to work with my peers on contemporary law enforcement issues and work towards solutions for the future. Attending this program was a great experience and honor, and I appreciate Lt. Nancy Hudson, Jason Cokinos and Brian Tanzi holding down the fort in my absence.

As we approach the summer, the 6th District is excited to launch the new Montgomery Village Team. This group, which was requested by

MCPD, supported by County Executive Ike Leggett and funded by the county council, will bring five police officers and one sergeant specifically dedicated to Montgomery Village.

The sergeant selected for the team is Sgt. Carlo Corvoisier. I have worked with Sgt. Corvoisier over the years, and he has a wide set of experience as a patrol officer in Wheaton, a Special Assignment Team officer, Special Investigations and more.

The Montgomery Village Team is a uniform patrol unit that will be focused on problem solving and improving the quality of life in the Village. The team will not be the primary responders for calls for service; rather they will be conducting patrols on mountain bikes, working on community problem solving and outreach, as well as enforcement duties. The Watkins Mill High School School Resource Officer will also be part of this team, ensuring that we have



a comprehensive approach to Montgomery Village.

In short, I am very pleased with the support that the 6th District continues to receive from the public, Chief Manger and our elected officials. Please come out to the Coffee with a Cop on Saturday April, 21 at the Lake Marion Community Center, 8821 East Village Avenue, to meet my team. Stay tuned for an updated 6th District newsletter to be published in early May with updated crime statistics and more.

evenings through July 5 and also be open on Saturdays from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. beginning May 12 through July 7. Please bring proof of residence, such as a driver's license, so that we may take your photo.

Please note, if an assessment account is not at a zero balance as of May 1, payment of any prior balance, as well as the full assessment amount through the end of the current fiscal year, must be received as a condition for issuance of an Activity Card or Validation Sticker.

Residents will need a current Validation Sticker on their photo activity card for entry to all MVF, Inc. pools. Validation Stickers for the residents who have received their photo Activity Card in previous years will be mailed in early May, to those residents who have returned their Information Letter and Rights Forms (if needed), if their assessment account is current, and there are no architectural violations on the property.

WHETSTONE WATCH

April Activities

by the Whetstone Board of **Directors**

The Goshen Road Widening Project, a long-standing Montgomery County Capital Improvement project, was featured in the Village News, EVP Message column in the March 23 issue. The proposed change to Goshen Road was described as a 4 to 6-lane major highway with a 105-foot minimum right-of-way with four through lanes divided by an 18-foot wide median, turn lanes at intersections, 5-foot bicycle lanes in both directions, a 5-foot sidewalk along the east side and an 8-foot shared path along the west side. Noise barriers were proposed at two locations along the west side of the project, directly to the south and to the north of Centerway Road. It appears that due to shifting priorities by the county council, the Goshen Road project will be delayed or never built as per the current design. This development is of considerable importance to the property owners along Goshen Road.

The county council held a public hearing April 3 on proposed legislation entitled ZTA 1802, Telecommunications Towers and new zoning changes for antennas. The impact of radiation emitted by these installations on the public health of residents and children is the subject of intense discussion.

County regulations applicable to Short-Term Rentals (Airbnb) approved by the county council will go into effect on Sunday, July 1. The Department of Health is currently developing these regulations designed to define who can operate a STR, what kind of dwelling can be rented, maximum days they can be rented, maximum number of overnight guests, licensing and notification requirements, advertising rules and tax rates. The survey question included in the Whetstone ballot indicated that residents overwhelming voted to oppose Short-Term Rentals in Whetstone. The board is preparing a covenant amendment for vote.

Bryan Price was appointed by the Whetstone Board to fill a vacancy on the board. He currently is employed by an IT firm in Reston. He and his family recently moved to the community and will provide fresh insights to issues confronted by Whetstone residents.

The maintenance committee performed the monthly community-wide inspection on April 3. Tasks included inspecting tree health, sewer lines, run-off drainage, pin oak trees on Centerway Road from Whetstone Drive to Goshen Road and remaining storm damage. Residents with maintenance concerns must contact MVF Community Management at whetstonehc@mvf.org or 240-243-2326 to avoid a delay in receiving your information and to ensure prompt attention to your needs.

Residents are invited to a meet with Montgomery County Police at the Lake Marion Community Center, 8821 East Village Avenue, on Saturday, April 21, from 9:30 to 11 a.m. This is an informal gathering and a great opportunity to discuss community issues. Youngsters and the young of heart can enjoy the open gym to shoot hoops as well.

If you observe trash dumping or residents placing trash or recyclables out on the wrong day, please e-mail northgateHC @comsource.com. You will remain anonymous.

The board is examining the possibility of participating in a county program to install pet waste stations in Northgate. There would be a one year free trial period in which the county would install and maintain the stations, after which Northgate would have to assume the costs. More information to follow.

KIDS AT PLAY

Spring is here, and that means children will be out running and playing. Drive slowly through our community and keep an eye out for children crossing streets, playing in the parking lots and running from between or behind cars. Safety is everyone's responsibility.

TRASH

Placing bulk trash in the community is a violation that is subject to a fine; any resident caught dumping bulk trash on Middle Village property will be fined \$250. Homeowners will be fined if they or their tenants violate the trash policy. Trash policy violations include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Placing trash out in plastic bags instead of a trash receptacle with a lid.
- 2. Placing trash/recycling out on inappropriate days/ non-pickup days.

3. Trashcans that are overflowing.

4. Placing trash out on common area spaces instead of in front of home.

Trash includes loose trash, bagged trash and trash in cans.

REMEMBER

- Do not place household trash or recycling out until the evening before pickup or the morning of pickup. Any other time is a violation of the community trash policy and is subject to fines.
- Place the lid firmly on the trash can.
- If you have more trash than what your trash can is able to hold, purchase an additional trash can!

Note: If it does not fit into the blue recycling container, it is not recycling. If it does not fit into a 35-gallon trashcan, it is not normal household trash. If it is vard waste, it must be in a paper bag or bundled and placed out with recycling.

STORM DRAINS

There are numerous storm drains located along the curbs throughout the community. Please do not dispose of any

items in the storm drains other than water! Placing an item such as a water bottle in the drain may seem harmless, but it can be the start of a very costly problem, which can translate into increased assessment fees. Remember, no bottles; paint cans; or hazardous materials such as paint, oils, gasoline, etc. are ever to be placed in the storm drains. Help keep our community water system flowing efficiently and protect your property from flood damage.

ASSESSMENTS

We live in a community that requires every homeowner to pay assessment fees. Assessments are used to pay contractors for landscaping, snow removal, trash collection, collection of illegally dumped trash, lighting, repairs on community property, etc. If you are a homeowner, you were provided with this information during closing.

Reminder: Assessments are due paid monthly. Your payment must be received by ComSource on or before the 15th of the month to avoid late charges. Your regular payments allow us to continue providing services to our community.

Homeowners who are delinquent with their assessment payments must pay their past due balance in full or make arrangements to pay them. The first step to making payment arrangements is to contact Delphine Matthews at 301-924-7355 or dmatthews@comsource.

DID YOU KNOW... THERE'S A POOPER **SCOOPER LAW?**

Animal Defecation ("pooper scooper" law) (Montgomery County Code, Sec. 5-203(a)(2)):

An owner must not allow an animal to damage or defecate on property outside of the owner's property. An animal may defecate on public property or the common area of property in which the owner shares an interest if the owner immediately removes and disposes of the feces by a sanitary method approved by the director. Feces may be picked up in a plastic bag. If this bag is placed inside another plastic bag, it may be put out for disposal in your normal household trash. Penalty for Violation: \$100.



North Village April board meeting

by the North Village Board of **Directors**

The April meeting of the board of directors was held on Thursday, April 19. It was too late for coverage in this issue of the Village News, so be sure to check the next issue for the full coverage.

The board first reviewed the minutes of the February board meeting, followed by the treasurer delivering the financial reports for February and March. Next, the nine committees gave their reports.

The management report from our community manager followed, announcing that the next maintenance inspection is scheduled for Wednesday, May 2 and that the mowing season will begin in approximately two weeks. Our landscaping contractor is presently performing dormant pruning of bushes in the townhome communities. Also there was to be a report on our last snow storm of the season on March 20 and March 21. Other items in the management report agenda were to be further discussed under the old and new busi-

The only item of old business was an update on the path lighting project, which replaces 53 path lighting fixtures with a new LED design previously selected by the board. Our community manager reported on meeting with the contractors who will be bidding on the project. Each contractor was provided with maps of the location of the fixtures in Picton, Perry Place and McRory, as well as information about the selected fixtures. After the board explores different options proposed by the contractors, a Request-for-Proposal (RFP) will be sent to each contractor to complete the bidding

Next, the board was to discuss new business, starting with the reaffirmation of the board policies. Eleven policies were to be presented to the board for their review and affirmation. This is done every year to ensure that all of our policies stay relevant and up to date. These policies cover such issues as parking, snow removal, trash, greenspace and community property use. Policies are necessary for the proper governance of the community and they can be reviewed on your Member Dashboard at www.montogmeryvillage.com.

The second item under new business was the discussion of the parking problems in the townhome communities. Management has received numerous complaints from residents in some of the townhome communities about the lack of parking. Some homes have four or more vehicles, and they use all of the visitor spaces daily.

The board is doing three things to help alleviate the strain on parking:

- Our security contractor has been asked to target the problem areas so that vehicles in violation can be towed. This has helped in a few spots.
- Our attorney has been asked to provide a written opinion whether we can remove reserved spaces of residents who are delinquent in paying their assessments. The opinion was expected to be available to the board at the time of the meeting.
- Management reported on an ongoing study of the parking in Essex Place, Perry Place and possibly McRory. On each street the study looks at the number of homes, the number of parking spaces, and the number of reserved parking spaces. It then calculates the remaining unreserved parking spaces. As expected, the results show that there are not enough spaces in any townhome community to provide residents with a second reserved parking

In the final item of new business, the board was asked to approve the Private Property Inspection Agreement (PPM) for 2018. Under this agreement the board contracts with the Montgomery Village Foundation to perform private property inspections of the 888 homes in North Village and to provide a report on violations. Violation letters will be sent to the homeowner if any violation is detected.



- School-age students in grades 6 through 12 are needed to participate in the "Future Vote" Program. Future Vote students will serve as Election Day student aides during the 2018 Gubernatorial Primary Election on Tuesday, June 26. There are also opportunities for students to assist the Board of Elections with a variety of activities before Election Day. Students and their guardians must attend mandatory training to participate in the Future Vote Program and, if applicable, students will receive Student Service Learning (SSL) credits.
- Students 16 or older are eligible to register to vote and serve as election workers. Each minor must demonstrate, to the satisfaction of the Maryland State Board of Elections, that they meet all qualifications for registration in the State. Students

- serving as election workers may choose to earn 25 Student Service Learning (SSL) credits in lieu of the stipend.

- Due to the diversity within the county, voters who speak multiple languages are also needed. Voters who are fluent in both English and Spanish are especially needed in each polling place to meet the requirements of Section 203 of the 1975 Voting Rights Act which stipulates that bilingual Spanish speakers be available at the polling places.
