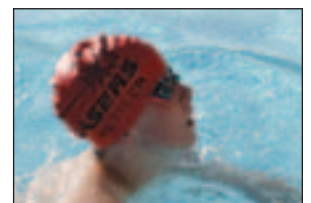

MONTGOMERY VILLAGE NEWS LETTERS TO THE EDITOR POLICY

1. The *Montgomery Village News* Letters to the Editor section is a community forum for Montgomery Village residents and/or property owners. In addition, at the Editor's discretion, the *Montgomery Village News* may print letters of appropriate interest to residents from others, including representatives of local schools, governments and businesses. Campaign letters are prohibited, except for Montgomery Village Foundation and Village homes corporation elections. The views expressed in the Letters to the Editor section are those of the authors of the letters and not necessarily those of the Montgomery Village Foundation (MVF) or its Board of Directors.

2. The *Montgomery Village News* will make every effort to publish all letters received during the weeks prior to

publication that meet the criteria of this policy.

3. All letters (typed, handwritten or e-mailed) must be received no later than 5 p.m. on the Monday prior to publication and distribution. When a holiday occurs on a deadline Monday, Letters to the Editor must be received no later than noon on the subsequent Tuesday prior to the Friday publication and distribution.

4. Letters must bear the writer's name, address and telephone number for verification purposes. E-mailed letters should contain the subject line "Letter to the Editor." The sole use of pen names, initials or the complete omission of a signature will eliminate a letter from consideration from publication. A request from the author to withhold the name or mark the letter anonymous will

eliminate the letter from consideration.

5. All letters are subject to condensation or deferral to the next issue by the editor for space considerations, if absolutely necessary. Editor is to so indicate any condensations.

6. All letters may not exceed 300 words. Longer letters will be eliminated from consideration for publication in the *Village News*. As time permits, the writers may be notified and given the opportunity to shorten the letter for future publication. Letters exceeding 300 words which meet all other criteria of this policy may be published on the MVF website.

7. The *Village News* respects the privacy of individuals and residents; letters should not contain references to specific persons, except when endorsing candidates for MVF or Village homes corporations.

tion elections or referencing a previously published article with a byline.

8. Letters submitted by an author regarding the same topic must present new information or opinions; repetitive submissions and/or form letters submissions will only be printed once.
9. Letters should be in reference to or contain information about topics relatable to all Montgomery Village residents. Letters addressed to or specifically about homes corporation or condominium association business and affairs will not be printed and may be directed to those association boards of directors when appropriate.

10. The Letters to the Editor section is not a forum for extensive debates; MVF encourages residents to use other avenues such as facebook and twitter for timely discussion.

11. MVF retains the right to respond to letters to the editor addressing specific issues involving it in the form of editor's notes or other methods at its discretion.

12. The Director of Communications, in his/her sole discretion, reserves the right to withhold from publication of inflammatory, slanderous, libelous, or lewd material, or material which may be an invasion of privacy, material deemed in bad taste and inconsistent with *Montgomery Village News* editorial policy, or other language which opens MVF to potential legal liability, and limit the number of letters on a given subject when the number is so large it presents a problem.

Be on the lookout for turtles

Eastern box turtles are making their way around Montgomery County as they enter their breeding and nesting season. This, combined with recent heavy rains, is causing an increase in movement by the turtles. Montgomery Parks, part of the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission, is offering a few tips for people who may encounter the turtles.

The turtles can be identified by the box-like pattern on their shell or carapace. They are typically 5 to 6 inches long, with slightly webbed toes. Most eastern box turtles have yellow markings on dark feet and faces.

According to Montgomery Parks Acting Natural Resources Manager Matthew Harper, the turtles should be left undisturbed if they are not in any immediate threat. When found in a roadway or other potentially dangerous area, the turtles can be carefully



moved in the direction they are headed.

"The turtles are out and about in parks this time of year, seeking their mates and suitable egg laying areas in which to dig and bury their nests," said Principal Natural Resources Specialist Ryan Butler.

"It is important to realize that this is a busy time of year for many turtle species throughout the region. Whenever possible, turtles of all types should be left in their natural habitat, not taken home as pets, and only moved from their location if they are in immediate danger."

Get involved in Stedwick

Summer has arrived, and with it all the activities we associate with summer—swimming, barbecuing, lawn mowing, vacationing and children playing. The Stedwick Pool, 10401 Stedwick Road, opened on May 19. Many of the other pools opened on May 26, with Hurley Park and Watkins Mill not opening until Saturday, June 16. To use the pools, you must have a current Montgomery Village Foundation (MVF) Activity Card. Residents of Stedwick will be getting a new photo Activity Card this year. You should have received an Information Letter/Rights Form already; if not, contact MVF as soon as possible. To get the card you must have a zero balance on your assessment account as of May 1. Any balance must be paid in addition to the full assessment amount through the end of the current fiscal year to receive an Activity Card.

Many of you have been to our monthly board meeting, and it is greatly appreciated. We understand the most pressing problem for almost all neighborhoods is parking. We have had many discussions on this topic, and MVF is aware and has had several meetings about it. We are exploring many different alternatives.

Montgomery Village was built to allow each home approximately 1.4 cars per address. At the time, the United States was not a car-centric nation, but we rapidly grew that way, and so we average more than one car per household. Some households have only one car and your neighbor has four. The simple solution would be to assign two parking places per household, but it's not quite that easy.

When looking at allocating parking spaces, many things must be considered. Does your unit have a garage and driveway? That would be two spaces, regardless of whether you use the garage or not. How do we assign the spaces? Do we use permits? How many permits per household? Do units with garages get permits? Do we assign all spaces as reserved, thus eliminating any guest or open spaces? The questions and discussion could be endless, but we all agree that something must be done. We encourage you to provide recommendations. We hope sometime in the future to have a meeting to discuss this further.

The Stedwick Homes Corporation board currently has two vacancies. If you have been wondering about "what does the board do," come to a meeting and find out for yourself.

We meet the third Wednesday of every month except July and December at 7:30 p.m. in the Stedwick Community Center, 10401 Stedwick Road.

Parking challenge

A few weeks ago, everyone received a notice from North Village Homes Corporation describing a change the board has approved in the current parking policy. This change takes effect on Friday, June 1. Enclosed with the notice was a copy of the broader parking policy that has been in place since North Village began, with a few modifications over the years and inclusive of the new Section 5.

The recent change described in Section 5 of the parking policy allows the board to suspend an owner's use of a designated parking space if the owner is delinquent on paying assessments for at least 12 months. The main purpose of the recent change is to encourage owners/residents to pay their assessments on a timely basis. A secondary purpose is to emphasize the scarcity of parking places in most of the townhome communities, and thus the need to conserve them for those who have paid their dues.

Parking has become a major challenge throughout the entire Village. Following a Village-wide discussion, Montgomery Village Foundation (MVF) made it clear that community center parking areas and other MVF-owned property will not be made available for overnight parking.

In response, we conducted a detailed survey of available parking spaces in North Village. We wanted to see if it was possible to designate two parking spaces per home, rather than the current practice of just one assigned space. We found that there exists an equivalent of only about 1.5 spaces per home in most of the townhome

communities. Paving over green space isn't feasible for a number of reasons; county zoning and water ordinances mandate the current configurations. Furthermore, we must maintain reasonable clearances for emergency vehicles on our streets. This becomes extremely difficult after snow events as it is. Although the original Kettler Brothers design was for a different age, we are basically stuck with it.

Those of us in townhomes face an extremely difficult challenge. We need real estate agents who sell our homes to be cognizant and realistic in selling our homes. We need patience in dealing with our neighbors over an emotion-filled issue. We will consider additional, formal permitting of spaces on a "first come" basis, but prefer to keep unmarked spaces open if it can be done peacefully and safely.

SUMMER NEWS

Some of you in lower the Chadburn area may have been aware of a water problem recently. Apparently, a leak had developed in a water main. WSSC removed two trees over the water main and repaired the leak—at no cost to North Village, fortunately. Often the homeowner or North Village is responsible for repairing water main breaks.

School will be out soon! Children are playing at all times of day. Please drive safely to protect them on our streets. Parents, please supervise your children. There have been a number of criminal incidents involving young children in the Village recently. The police have expanded surveillance at the Village Center, but incidents can happen there or more locally.

FINANCE REVIEW

April's financials show, at a top level, our community is in a good financial position. The only expense that continues to be higher than we budgeted is electricity. Our April expense was \$400 more than we incurred for the same month last year and, at its current pace, would end up with a higher year end expense than we budgeted.

The March windstorm pushed our site maintenance over budget for the year. These two expenses are more than offset by savings in the audit, shrub replacement and fence repair costs.

We are also fortunate that there were no April snow storms to push our snow removal budget over budget. With the crazy weather we have had, this was no guarantee. There are a couple of categories where no expense has been incurred yet; unfortunately, that is primarily due to the timing of those expenses and not because of some of mystery expense saving.

Forest Oak Middle School launches project to revitalize on-campus outdoor education facilities

Forest Oak Middle School (FOMS) is undertaking an ambitious project to restore and improve an on-campus outdoor learning ecosystem, which includes a natural amphitheater, greenhouse, outdoor commons, a meadow and a forest/stream environment with nature trail. The school announced that Gaithersburg-based Emergent BioSolutions, a global specialty life sciences company, has jumpstarted the project with a \$2,000 donation that will be earmarked for building a greenhouse and establishing raised garden beds.

The project is being led by FOMS Principal Shahid Muhammad, 7th grade science

teacher Shawn Carter and parent Emily Cavey, in conjunction with mentor Stephen Meador, CEM, LEED AP.

FOMS, which services residents in East Village, is located on a beautiful 40-acre campus that is rich with natural resources. When the school opened in 1999, it featured outdoor learning resources that were initially used by teachers and students. Over time, the outdoor resources were neglected, fell into a state of disrepair and were unable to be utilized to their full extent.

"Our location affords us an excellent opportunity to educate our students about the native ecosystem," said Muham-

mad. "The revitalization of this unique outdoor learning space will be valuable in encouraging students to get outside to explore and appreciate nature as part of our curriculum."

FOMS parents, students, staff and community volunteers marked Earth Day with an Outdoor Education Area Clean-Up event at the school on Sunday, April 22. Volunteers began working to replace and repair several bridges over the stream on the property, cleaning up a nature trail, fixing benches, building a chalkboard and constructing raised lettuce beds.

"Sustaining the environment is one of the focus areas of

our eGIVE program that seeks to build safer and healthier communities and is tied directly to our overall mission of protecting and enhancing life," said Lynn Kieffer, vice president, Corporate Communications at Emergent BioSolutions. "Our headquarters is just a few miles from Forest Oak Middle School, so we are thrilled to be part of this important outdoor education initiative that benefits both its students and our community."

CONTINUED FINANCIAL SUPPORT NEEDED

In addition to volunteer time and effort, approximately

\$11,000 will be needed to fund needed restoration activities, including construction of a greenhouse, raised garden beds and outdoor amphitheater seating. The generous support from Emergent BioSolutions is being supplemented by a GoFundMe campaign, which was established to accept donations from individuals, local businesses and other supporters.
